Poster Specifications

- Size: All posters must be at least 22"x28" and no larger than 24"X36" to be considered for judging.
- Media: Contestant may use any art media (marker, crayon, paint, collage, textiles, etc.), but please consider posters will need to be packaged, mailed, and reproduced.
- All entries must be mailed flat.
- All contestants must sign a release making their entry the property of HRHC and permitting duplication/publication thereof. The release should be secured to the back of the entry. (See other side.)
- All contestants are asked to provide a short narrative on the inspiration, vision, and importance of their poster design. The narrative should also be secured on the back of the entry.
- Contestant's name, grade level, and school must be written on the back of the poster entry in addition to being listed on the release form.
- HRHC is only responsible for returning the original poster to the grand prize winner. HRHC is not responsible for returning poster.
- Ages: Available to all elementary school children (K-5th grade)

Judging Criteria

Entries will be judged on creativity, composition and the artist's statement.
